PELLS OF ST. PETER - Electricians

Did you know.....

- LED lights can use a fifth of the energy that conventional halogen bulbs use and there is no heat produced- a lot safer.
- A 30mA RCD fitted to your fuse board or an installed mains smoke detector could save your life.
- New build sockets and switches should be between 450mm and 1200mm from finished floor level to allow accessibility.
- Cables buried in walls should be run in prescribed zones?

Pells of St. Peter can help you with these issues and more as qualified electricians. Electricians now have to work to BS 7671 2008 (IET Wiring Regulations 17th Edition).

In 2006 the government introduced Part P of the building regulations and formed a government approved registration scheme for electrical installers. Vincent Pells is an ELECSA government approved electrician.

Certain kinds of electrical work have to be notified to building control. These include: Indoors:

- A complete new installation or rewire
- Changing a fuse box
- Installing a new circuit
- Underfloor heating
- Adding a socket/lighting point in a kitchen/ bathroom

Outdoors:

• Installing lights or power e.g. a supply to a garden shed, detached garage, outbuilding, electric gate or pond pump

As registered electricians, we can do all of these for you. Some of the contracts we have completed include the rewire of St. Joseph's Church Hall and the installation of a complete wiring system for Hibiscus Beauty Clinic in Stoke Poges from ground level to working building. We have carried out work at St. Joseph's School, Seer Green School and Thorpe House School. We have also carried out work at St Peter's Church, Chalfont St Peter Community Centre and Bucks County Council. One of the larger contracts we had was to relocate a manufacturing company Case Design form Chalfont St. Peter to a new factory in High Wycombe along with all their three phase machinery.

We carry out all domestic work and this includes the latest technology with energy saving devices and LED lighting. If you need an outdoor socket for your Christmas lights or LED lighting, why not contact us?
